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There are two important criteria which are applied in determining whether or not a submitted paper is suitable for publication in *The Annals of Applied Probability*, beyond formal correctness and coherence. These are: (a) The results in the paper should be genuinely applied or applicable. (b) The paper should make a serious contribution to the mathematical theory of Probability, or in some other sense carry a substantial level of probabilistic innovation, or be likely to stimulate such innovation.

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
