

THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN EVANSTON

The five hundred fifty-second meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois on Friday and Saturday, November 28–29, 1958. There were about 125 registrants at the meeting, 110 of whom were members of the Society.

At the invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Western Sectional Meeting Professor Roger Lyndon of the University of Michigan addressed the Society on *Properties preserved under algebraic operations*. He was introduced by Professor H. A. Osborn.

There was one session for contributed papers on Friday and two on Saturday with Professors Eldon Dyer, W. M. Boothby and P. C. Hammer presiding.
