

THE NOVEMBER MEETING IN LA JOLLA

The six hundred thirty-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, November 19, 1966, at the University of California, San Diego, in La Jolla, California. There were 145 registrants at this meeting, 130 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, two hour addresses were given at this meeting. The first speaker was Professor Robert Finn of Stanford University. The title of his address was *The ends of open complete surfaces*. The afternoon speaker was Professor Calvin Moore of the University of California, Berkeley, whose talk was entitled *Unitary representations of locally compact groups*.

There were four sessions for contributed papers, with R. B. Killgrove, M. Rajagopalan, Helmut Rohrl, and S. G. Williamson presiding.
