# CONSTITUTION.

### ARTICLE I.

This Society shall be called the New York Mathematical Society.

#### ARTICLE II.

The object of the Society shall be to encourage and maintain an active interest in mathematical science.

### ARTICLE III.

The officers of the Society shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Librarian, and a Committee of Publication, which shall consist of two members, either or both of whom may at the same time hold any other office or offices.

#### ARTICLE IV.

The officers of the Society, together with five other members, shall constitute a Council, which shall have general charge of the affairs of the Society.

### ARTICLE V.

- r. The officers of the Society and the other members of the Council shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting of each year, a majority of the votes cast being necessary to election. Their term of service shall be one year and until their successors shall be elected.
- 2. Such vacancies as may at any time exist among the officers, or in the Council of the Society, shall be filled by the Council.

## ARTICLE VI.

This Constitution shall not be amended unless notice of the proposed change be given in writing at a meeting of the Society, and such amendment receive the affirmative votes of four-fifths of the members present at the following meeting.
