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The first page of each article, including research announcements, that is submitted for publication should be ar a descriptive title which should be short, but informative. Useless or vague phrases such as "some remarks about" or "concerning" should be avoided. Before the first footnote, there should be the AMS(MOS) subject classification numbers representing the primary and secondary subjects of the article. If a list of key words and phrases describing the subject matter of the article is included, it will also be printed as a footnote on the first page. The AMS(MOS) Subject Classification Scheme (1970) with instructions for its use can be found as an appendix to MATHEMATICAL REVIEWS, index to volume 39 (1970). See the June 1970 NOTICES for more details, as well as illustrative examples. The subscription price is \$12 per annual volume of six numbers.
