- **THE 2004 SACKS PRIZE AWARDED JOINTLY TO J. MILETI AND N. SEGERLIND.** The ASL Committee on Prizes and Awards has selected Joseph Mileti of the University of Chicago and Nathan Segerlind of the University of Washington as the recipients of the 2004 Sacks Prize. The prize consists of a cash award plus five years free membership in the ASL for each awardee. Mileti received his Ph.D. in 2004 from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, under the supervision of Carl Jockusch. His thesis, *Partition theorems and computability theory*, was cited by the Prizes and Awards Committee as containing a “penetrating computability theoretical analyses of Ramsey-type theorems, an important feature of which is an ingenious completely new proof of the Canonical Ramsey Theorem whose ideas allowed a deep effective analysis of this theorem.” Segerlind received his Ph.D. in 2004 from the University of California, San Diego, under the supervision of Sam Buss and Russell Impagliazzo. The Committee noted that his thesis, *New Separations in Propositional Proof Complexity*, “extends switching lemmas, one of the most primary tools in the area, in a very unexpected way, that, among other things allowed him to take, in a single step, one important proof system from an almost complete mystery to being almost completely understood.”
- **ASL MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE.** By action of the ASL Council, in the year 2006 the dues for individual membership in the Association will increase to US\$76; in 2005 the dues are US\$70, and they have been at this rate since 2003. (For student members, the 2006 dues will be US\$38 and in 2005 they are US\$35, as they have been since 2003.) According to the ASL Constitution, if by August 1, 2005, at least 5 percent of the individual members petition the Secretary-Treasurer, the increase in dues would have to be approved in the 2005 ASL Election by a majority of those voting.
- **REDUCED DUES FOR INDIVIDUALS AND INSTITUTIONS IN DEVELOPING ECONOMIES.** The ASL recently approved a program to offer reduced dues for individual and institutional members in developing economies. For 2005, the reduced dues are US\$18 for individuals and US\$130 for institutional members. These dues apply to individuals and institutions residing in countries whose economies are classified as ‘lower middle income’ or below on the World Bank’s annual list.
