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Footnotes, except a possible acknowledgement of assistance or financial support on the first page, should be avoided by being incorporated into the text, perhaps parenthetically.

The list of references must be in alphabetic-chronological order; abbreviations of names of journals and references to books should follow the standard form established by Mathematical Rieviews. The following references are two typical examples:
