

#### EDITORIAL NOTE

In offering to the scientific world a new periodical for formal logic and foundations of mathematics, the University of Notre Dame has taken account of the growing volume of work being accomplished in a flourishing and significant field in which it has for some time taken an increasingly active interest. Pressure on existing space is known to be considerable, and to result in delayed publication of valuable material. It is hoped that the opportunity provided by these pages will make this situation easier.

It is expected that the great majority of contributions will be concerned with purely technical matters, expounded in accord with scientific standards; strictly relevant discussion of a more philosophical character will not, however, be excluded. New materials in the history of logic, where so much still remains to be investigated, are also hoped for.

While papers submitted for publication should normally be in English, those written in French or German will not be thereby excluded. Reviews of books will not at present be undertaken as a regular feature, though review-articles or critical notices may from time to time be published in special cases.

The University extends its thanks to those who have generously accepted the invitation to co-operate in the first issue.
