

Instructions to Authors

“Nihonkai Mathematical Journal” (NMJ) publishes original contributions in all disciplines in mathematics. Each volume will consist of two issues, and each issue will appear semi-annually. In exceptional cases a volume consists of only one issue. All papers will be refereed. For a manuscript to be acceptable for publication, not only should it contain new and interesting results, but it should also be written in the prescribed form following the guidelines below. Two copies of the paper (or its pdf file) should be sent directly to any member of the Editorial Board. If there is no Subject Editor representing the topic of the paper, the manuscript should be sent to the Editor-in-Chief. Manuscripts will be reproduced directly by a photographic process. It is important that the following instructions should be adhered to closely.

Paper and form of type: All papers must be written in English. The manuscript should be prepared in $\text{T}_{\text{E}}\text{X}$ or $\text{L}^{\text{A}}\text{T}_{\text{E}}\text{X}$, printed on one side of A4 white paper (12 point type size, text width 15cm and text height 22cm).

Title page: The title should be 5cm from the topmost edge of the paper, and be accompanied with the name(s) of author(s), an abstract, Mathematics Subject Classification, a list of key words and phrases.

Last page: Complete postal address of author(s) should follow the references (on the same page). A space of at least 2cm above the bottom margin should be left for the publisher to insert the date of receipt of the manuscript.

Footnotes: Should be typed at the bottom of the page where it is cited.

Mailing: Care in case of submitting hard copy should be taken in packing manuscripts, which should be enclosed between cardboards to prevent damage in the post.

Reprint: 50 free reprints of each article will be supplied to the corresponding author.

Copyright transfer: The copyright on all published articles will be held by the Nihonkai Mathematical Journal. The NMJ copyright transfer form can be downloaded at <http://mathweb.sc.niigata-u.ac.jp/nmj/>. A manuscript cannot be published unless it is accompanied by a copyright transfer.
