Undergraduate Analysis Posters. The AMS 2017 Spring Western Sectional held at Washington State University April 22-23 in Pullman, Washington, featured a special session entitled *Early Career Research and Exposition: Posters and Discussions* on the second day of the conference. The organizers of the poster session solicited projects from the entirety of the mathematical sciences in both original research and in exposition that finds new ways to illuminate known results. The *Real Analysis Exchange* was contacted to provide judges for the analysis projects. Additionally, the *Exchange* volunteered to publish abstracts of the top ranked analysis projects and to provide a link to the corresponding posters on the Michigan State University website,
