THE FEBRUARY MEETING IN NEW YORK

The five hundred ninety-eighth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at The City College in New York City on Saturday, February 23, 1963. About 151 persons attended, including 125 members of the Society.

Professor Masatake Kuranishi of Columbia University addressed the Society by invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings. His title was On the theory of infinite Lie groups. Professor Leo Zippin introduced the speaker.

There were four sessions for the presentation of contributed papers, at which 21 papers were scheduled. The presiding officers at these sessions were Dr. A. S. Galbraith and Professors Selby Robinson, Arthur Sard, and Albert Wilansky.
