Manuscripts (including notes and references) should be double-spaced with wide margins. The editors request that the author's name and institutional affiliation be kept on a separate cover sheet. Handwritten symbols, ambiguous symbols (l vs 1, o vs O and 0), and non-Roman characters should be identified in the margin. Two copies should be sent to *Editors*, *P.O. Box 5*, *Notre Dame*, *Indiana 46556*, *U.S.A*. We regret that manuscripts cannot be returned unless postage is included.

Page proofs are sent to authors for correction of errors that occur in composition. Any special composition costs arising from an author's revision of the text in proof will be charged to the author. Fifty reprints, without covers, will be supplied free of charge; covers or additional reprints may be purchased.
