Correction Note

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We apologize for an unfortunate error that has crept into our paper "Multiple testing for exploratory research" [Statistical Science 26 (4) 584–597]. The inequality sign in equation (8) should have been reversed and, as a consequence, the stronger version of the shortcut (7) requires both (6) and (8), rather than (8) alone, to be valid. The proof of the shortcut in Appendix B uses the correct, reversed (8). The following needs to be changed to repair our mistake:

- 1. In (8) the inequality sign needs to be reversed.
- 2. Just above (8), "if we have" should be "if we have (6) and".
- 3. 6 lines below (8), remove "the stronger".
- 4. In Appendix B, final paragraph, replace "Analogously, if (8) holds, choose ..." by "Analogously, if (6) and (8) both hold, choose ...".
- 5. In Appendix B, the text just below the final display "noting, in the last inequality, that $\#J \le n \tilde{s}$ and that (8) implies (6)." should be "using (6) in the last equality, noting that $\#J \le n \tilde{s}$."

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
