

## THE OCTOBER MEETING IN CAMBRIDGE

The six hundred sixty-eighth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, on Saturday, October 25, 1969. There were 109 registrants including 95 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Eastern Sectional Meetings, there were two invited addresses. Professor John T. Tate of Harvard University spoke on  $K_2$  of global fields; he was introduced by Professor David Mumford. Professor Hyman Bass of Columbia University spoke on  $K_2$  of global fields; he was introduced by Professor Arthur Mattuck.

There were four sessions for twenty-one contributed papers, chaired by Professors F. G. Asenjo, J. W. Brown, G. Stolzenberg and S. Zaidmen.
