The Philosopher's Index: An International Index to Philosophical Periodicals. An up-to-date quarterly index with abstracts from more than 300 international philosophy and interdisciplinary journals. An annual cumulative edition is also published. In addition, two retrospective indexes have been published, i.e., the Retrospective Index to U.S. Publications From 1940 and the Retrospective Index to non-U.S. English Language Publications From 1940.

Philosophy Research Archives: A Bilingual Microfiche Journal of Philosophy, sponsored by the APA, the CPA, and the PDC, is the microfiche journal of philosophy which provides a means of publication that is free of many of the disadvantages and constraints of ordinary journal publication. In addition, the Archives accepts articles, translations, monographs, and bibliographies.

Teaching Philosophy. Explores ideas about teaching and learning philosophy by publishing articles, discussions, and reports on new courses, methods, materials and their impact on philosophy. Textbook and audio-visual reviews are regular features.

Directory of American Philosophers. A handbook of philosophy covering the United States and Canada with information on faculties of philosophy, names, addresses, and specialties of philosophers, data on colleges and universities, philosophical societies, centers, institutes, journals, publishers, and data on fellowships and assistantships (types and dollar amounts) available in philosophy. Statistics on the profession.

International Directory of Philosophy and Philosophers. A handbook of philosophy covering Europe, Central and South America, Asia, Africa, and Australia. This directory provides names, addresses, and specialties of philosophers as well as data on colleges, universities, philosophical societies, institutes, journals, and publishers of philosophical works.

Directory of Women in Philosophy. A handbook of women in philosophy, with information on fields of specialization, degree (date and institution), dissertation or publications, position, institution, dossier source, address, and telephone number.

Bibliographies of Famous Philosophers. Hardbound bibliographies have been published on Edmund Husserl, Jean-Paul Sartre, Alfred North-Whitehead, and Henri Bergson. Forthcoming bibliographies include works on Martin Heidegger, George Santayana, and a revised Sartre bibliography.

Dialog. A computerized search service which provides custom bibliographies with abstracts on any logical combination of philosophical topics.

Mailing Labels of approximately 10,000 philosophers in the United States and Canada are available as well as addresses by specialty, i.e., Ethics, Aesthetics, etc. **Journal Typesetting.** Journals are economically typeset using computer driven

Bibliography of Philosophy. The PDC, the U.S. national center, selects books for review, and forwards the reviews to editors in Paris.

The editors request that the author's name and institutional affiliation be kept on a separate cover sheet whenever possible. Two copies should be sent to the Editors, Box 5, Notre Dame, Indiana 46556, U.S.A. We regret that manuscripts cannot be returned unless postage is included.

Page proofs are sent to authors for correction of errors that occur in composition. Any special composition costs arising from an author's revision of the text in proof will be charged to the author. Fifty reprints, without covers, will be supplied free of charge; covers or additional reprints may be purchased.

The Notre Dame Journal of Formal Logic is published quarterly by the University of Notre Dame in January, April, July and October.
