### A NOTE AND CORRECTION ON ZBIGNIEW LIS' CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE TREE METHOD

In my paper *From semantic tableaux to Smullyan trees: the history of the falsifiability tree method* (THIS JOURNAL, 1 (1990), 36-69), I incorrectly stated (p. 44) that the deduction rules for Lis' tableaux do not admit branching. As Perry Smith has kindly and correctly reminded me, the rules presented by Lis do in fact permit branching. More precise details will be presented in my forthcoming book *Van Heijenoort: Logic and Its History in the Work and Writings of Jean van Heijenoort*.
