TENTATIVE PROGRAM OF IASPS ACTIVITIES IN 1971 IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE 38th SESSION OF ISI

The 1971 activities of the International Association for Statistics in Physical Sciences (IASPS are planned to consist of three parts: (1) several "satellite symposia," each given to a separate domain of study; (2) a few sessions in Washington, D.C. to be held conjointly with the International Statistical Institute (ISI); and (3) several sessions to be held in Fort Collins, Colorado, conjointly with the Annual Meetings of the Institute of Mathematical Statistics (IMS) and of the American Statistical Association (ASA).

The following satellite symposia are in varying degrees of crystallization.

- (v) Metallurgy. Organizer: W. L. Nicholson, Systems and Electronics Division, Battelle Memorial Institute, Richland, Wash. 99352

In principle the IASPS Satellite Symposia will be based on invited papers. However, in some cases, a few sessions for contributed papers are being contemplated. All inquiries should be addressed to the Organizers.

Summaries of symposia (i) and (ii) are expected to be presented in a few expository papers, at the joint IASPS-ISI meetings in Washington, D.C. Summaries of the other, more technical symposia may be presented at the IASPS meeting, joint with IMS and ASA, in Fort Collins, Colorado. In addition, the following sessions are planned for the latter meeting.

- (a) A Commemorative Session for William Feller and Alfred Rényi, both deceased in 1970.
- (b) Several sessions with invited papers on theory of statistics and on probability, organized by Herman Chernoff (Department of Statistics, Stanford University, Stanford, Calif. 94305) in consultation with the IMS and the ASA Program Committees.
 - (c) Sessions for contributed papers organized jointly with IMS and/or ASA.

(ii) A scholar, not a member of the ISI, may become an IASPS member through the following three steps: (a) he must be sponsored by three members of the IASPS, citizens of at least two different countries; (b) the nomination must be approved by the IASPS Council, and (c) the candidate must undertake to abide by the IASPS Statutes, which includes the payment of annual dues, currently twenty Swiss gold francs.

NOMINATIONS REQUESTED FOR AMERICAN MEN OF SCIENCE, 12th EDITION

Work on the 12th Edition of American Men of Science has begun at the Jaques Cattell Press in Tempe, Arizona, with publication of the first volume of the set planned for mid 1971. The new edition will follow the general plan of the 11th edition, an alphabetical arrangement of biographies of scientists in the Physical and Biological Sciences. The continued increase in the number of research scientists in these fields indicates that this edition will be even larger than the last edition. The new edition will be published over a three-year period, followed by the volumes on the Social and Behavioral Sciences.

The directory will be published under the joint imprint of Cattell/Bowker. The R. R. Bowker Company (a Xerox Company) has continued the series following the death of Jaques Cattell during publication of the 10th edition, with the same high standards that have been maintained since its inception in 1906.

The criteria of former editions will be followed:

- (1) Achievement, by reason of experience and training, of a stature in scientific work at least equivalent to that associated with the doctoral degree, coupled with presently continued activity in such work; or
- (2) Research activity of high quality in science as evidenced by publication in reputable scientific journals; or, for those whose work cannot be published because of governmental or commercial or industrial security, research activity of high quality in science as evidenced by the judgment of the individual's peers among his immediate co-workers; or
- (3) Attainment of a position of substantial responsibility requiring scientific training and experience of approximately the extent described for (1) and (2).
