

THE APRIL MEETING IN CHICAGO

The six hundred twenty-first meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the University of Chicago on Friday and Saturday, April 9, 10. There were 346 registrants, 310 of whom were members of the Society.

All the sessions were held at the University of Chicago's Center for Continuing Education.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Western Sectional Meetings, there were addresses by Professor C. Ionescu Tulcea of the University of Illinois on *The lifting property and the disintegration of measures*, Professor James Kister of the University of Michigan on *Euclidean bundles and topological manifolds*, and Professor E. M. Stein of the University of Chicago on *Boundary values of holomorphic and harmonic functions of several variables*. These sessions were introduced by Professors Louis Brickman, R. H. Bing, and R. P. Boas. By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Western Sectional Meetings, a Special Session of 20-minute papers on *Harmonic analysis* was held on Saturday at 3:15 P.M. with the following speakers: Professors A. M. Garsia, Walter Rudin, V. L. Shapiro, Mary C. Weiss, and Henry Helson. This Special Session was organized and chaired by Professor R. P. Boas.

Sessions for the presentation of contributed papers were held at 3:15 P.M. on Friday and both at 9:00 A.M. and 3:15 P.M. on Saturday. Presiding officers were Professors C. E. Weil, P. A. Fillmore, Daniel Zelinsky, V. L. Shapiro, S. G. Mrowka, R. A. Askey, D. M. Topping, and R. Wells.
