Preface

This volume consists of peer-reviewed original articles submitted by speakers at the 11th Mathematical Society of Japan, Seasonal Institute (MSJ-SI) "The Role of Metrics in the Theory of Partial Differential Equations", held for the period of July 2–13, 2018 in Hokkaido University, Sapporo. The seasonal institute was supported by the Mathematical Society of Japan and the Department of Mathematics, Hokkaido University. During the period, various kinds of approaches to the analysis of partial differential equations (PDEs) were presented by 6 course lecturers and 46 invited lecturers. These lectures cover a huge variety of fields including PDEs, numerical analysis, harmonic analysis and geometric analysis. The organizing committee members are Y. Giga, H. Kubo, and T. Ozawa.

Sapporo is known to be one of the centers of nonlinear PDEs. The seasonal institute was just held in the year of 150 years anniversary since Hokkaido was founded. The lecturers are Dr. Claus Dohmen, Dr. Takashi Takemoto, and Dr. Kouta Usui. In all, we had over 200 participants and fruitful interactions among participants through theses lectures. In this way, we successfully concluded the seasonal institute.
