The Eighth International Conference on Geometry, Integrability and Quantization took place, as in previous years, at the Sts. Constantin and Elena resort on the Black Sea coast of Bulgaria from the 9th to the 14th of June 2006.

The lectures covered a wide range of topics, stretching from classical differential geometry and integrable systems methods in geometry and physics to theoretical physics.
