EDITORIAL MESSAGES

During its initial three years the Real Analysis Exchange has been comprised of three major sections, each with a separate charge. A description of each section can be found below. Of these, the most heterogeneous has been the Inroads Section where articles have ranged from summaries of work to appear elsewhere to self contained research papers. This was as anticipated, however, the Mathematical Reviews has requested that we identify primary source material with a separate section heading. For this reason we are initiating a new section, to first appear Fall '78, entitled Research Articles (mundane, but suggested by the editor of the Reviews). The Inroads Section will continue to publish annotated abstracts, research summaries, and abstracts of lengthy unpublished works such as Ph.D. dissertations. As you probably have noticed, the entire Exchange is reviewed by Zentralblatt für Mathematik and now the Research Articles as well as $\overline{Topical Surveys}$ (already reviewed) will be reviewed by Mathematical Reviews. We have had a number of inquiries from readers concerning our refereeing policies. Papers submitted to the new Research Article Section will be sent to two referees for their independent judgment; this has been the policy for research articles which have been submitted as Inroads in the past. Annotated abstracts submitted to the Inroads Section are normally sent to a single referee who verifies appropriateness. Descriptions of each section of the Exchange follow.

Section 1: Topical Surveys

This section consists of survey articles concerning one area of current research activity. These articles would differ from survey articles in major journals both in their more limited scope and greater depth. It is anticipated that such a survey article would indicate a stream of mathematical thought from origins of the current problem area up to and including unpublished results. *Topical Survey* articles are refereed and reviewed by both the Mathematical Reviews and Zentralblatt fur Mathematik.

Section 2: Research Articles

This section is reserved for original research in the areas of real analysis, functions of real variables, and real set theory. As this section is intended for primary source material, the results published in this section should not appear in unabstracted form elsewhere. Papers submitted as *Research Articles* will be refereed prior to publication and reviews of *Research Articles* will appear in both the <u>Mathematical Reviews</u> and <u>Zentralblatt</u> fur Mathematik.

Section 3: Inroads

This third section consists of annotated abstracts of the recent work of real analysts coupled with bibliographic information concerning this work. In addition, the *Inroads Section* can well serve the need to publicize real analysis dissertation results. *Inroads* are referred and reviews of *Inroads* will appear in <u>Zentral</u>blatt fur Mathematik.

Section 4: Queries

In this section problems are presented together with appropriate bibliographical and historical information. This is not meant to be a recreational section but a forum for the presentation of unsolved problems in specific areas of real analysis. Notice to Contributors

- 1. Any author interested in writing a Topical Survey article should contact one of the Managing Editors for information concerning format and length.
- 2. Research Articles as well as Inroads should be typed in camera-ready form. They should have one inch margins on the top and bottom and one and one-half inch margins on both sides for binding purposes. The deadline for acceptance of these articles is November 1 for the Winter edition of the Exchange. The deadline for the Spring Exchange is April 1.
- 3. Queries should be typed and any appropriate bibliographical or historical information should be included. Solutions to previous Queries should have the same margins as the Inroads articles and should also be in camera-ready form. Lengthy Query solutions will be published within the Inroads section of the Exchange. The deadline for Queries to be published in the Winter Exchange is November 15 and the deadline for the Spring Exchange is April 1.
