

#### **GUIDE TO AUTHORS**

The *Journal* encourages submission of articles in all areas of philosophical and mathematical logic; philosophy of language and formal semantics for natural languages; the philosophy, history, and foundations of logic and mathematics; the philosophy and semantics for natural language.

Manuscripts (including notes and references) should be typed on one side of the page only, double-spaced with wide margins. Since manuscripts are refereed anonymously, we ask that the author's name and institutional affiliation be kept on a separate cover sheet. Handwritten symbols, uppercase vs lowercase letters, ambiguous symbols (I vs 1, o vs O and 0), and non-Roman characters should be identified in the margin. Abstracts are required and should be placed at the beginning of the paper. Notes should be indicated in the text by a superscript number and grouped at the end of the manuscript text, preceding the references. References should be listed alphabetically by the first author's last name. References should include the article title, unabbreviated journal name, volume number, year, and page numbers. References to books should include the publisher, city, and year of publication. Three copies should be sent to Editors, P.O. Box 5, Notre Dame, Indiana 46556, U.S.A.

Page proofs are sent to authors for correction of errors that occur in composition. Any special composition costs arising from an author's revision of the text in proof may be charged to the author. Fifty reprints, without covers, will be supplied free of charge; covers or additional reprints may be purchased.

The Notre Dame Journal of Formal Logic is published quarterly by the University of Notre Dame in the Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall. Yearly subscriptions are \$45.00 for institutions and \$25.00 for individuals. Back volumes are \$20.00 each for Volumes 1-10 and \$40.00 each for Volumes 11-31.
