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SUMMER MEETING OF THE INSTITUTE

A meeting of the Institute will be held in Hanover, New Hampshire, September 10-12, 1940 in conjunction with the meetings of the American Mathematical Society and the Mathematical Association of America. The Institute will hold its regular session for contributed papers on Tuesday morning. On Tuesday afternoon there will be a joint session with the American Mathematical Society for contributed papers. A session on the *Theory of Probability* will be held on Wednesday morning at which Professor J. L. Doob of the University of Illinois will give an address entitled *Probability as Measure* and Professor R. von Mises of Harvard University an address entitled *On the Foundations of Probability and Statistics*. The final session of the meetings will be held on Thursday morning. This session, to be devoted to the *Theory of Statistical Estimation*, will consist of addresses by Professor J. Neyman of the University of California and Doctor Joseph F. Daly of the Catholic University of America. Professor Neyman will speak on *Estimation by Intervals as a Problem in Classical Probability* and Doctor Daly will address the Institute on *Statistical Estimation in Large Samples*.

Abstracts of contributed papers must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Institute by August 1. Each contributed paper will be limited to ten minutes.
