

THE JUNE MEETING IN EUGENE

The six hundred twenty-fourth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held on Saturday, June 19, 1965 at the University of Oregon in Eugene, Oregon, in conjunction with meetings of the Pacific Northwest Section of the Mathematical Association of America and the Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics. There were 158 registrants at this meeting, 111 of whom were members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for Far Western Sectional Meetings, an hour address was given by Professor Murray Protter of the University of California at Berkeley. The title of this address was *The maximum principle*. Professor Paul Civin introduced Professor Protter.

There were four sessions for contributed papers with Professors W. R. Ballard, Ronald Harrop, V. C. Williams, and R. M. Winger presiding.
