THE NOVEMBER MEETING AT CHAPEL HILL, NORTH CAROLINA

The six hundred ninety-ninth meeting of the American Mathematical Society was held at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on Friday and Saturday, November 24–25, 1972. There were 347 registrations including 321 members of the Society.

By invitation of the Committee to Select Hour Speakers for the South-eastern Sectional Meetings, hour addresses were given by J. K. Brooks of the University of Florida and Robert Gilmer of Florida State University. Professor B. J. Pettis introduced Professor Brooks who talked about Measure and integration theory in Banach spaces. Professor Joe L. Mott introduced Professor Gilmer who talked about Some results on polynomial rings over a commutative ring.

There were two special sessions on Friday at 2:15 P.M. The first session on Applied Mathematics was chaired by Professor Christopher Hunter of Florida State University. The other special session on Friday on Infinite Dimensional Topology was chaired by Professor R. D. Anderson of Louisiana State University. In addition to the special sessions six sessions for contributed papers were held on Friday at 2:30 P.M. These sessions were chaired by Professors R. E. Chandler, N. Heerema, Gordon Johnson, C. W. McArthur, D. D. Miller, and D. L. Sumners.

At 10:15 A.M. on Saturday the second half of the special session on Infinite Dimensional Topology chaired by R. D. Anderson was held. There were also six sessions for contributed papers held on Saturday at 10:15 A.M. chaired by Professors Steven Blumsack, Peter Gibson, O. G. Harrold, Stuart Mills, Joe L. Mott, and Phillip Zenor.

The University of North Carolina hosted a Cocktail Hour at 5:00 P.M. on Friday and a dutch treat beer party at 8:00 P.M. Friday evening. Professor E. A. Cameron was in charge of local arrangements.
