Ratio continues in a new form philosophical aims pursued with uncommon seriousness and courage in the *Abhandlungen der Fries'schen Schule*. The *Abhandlungen* were established in 1847 by Ernst Friedrich Apelt and re-established in 1904 by Leonard Nelson. Their publication was interrupted in 1937, but, in 1957, Julius Kraft, a pupil of Nelson, revived this work by founding *Ratio*.

The *Journal* encourages submission of articles in all areas of philosophical and mathematical logic, the philosophy, foundations and history of logic and mathematics, and semantics for natural language. Manuscripts (including footnotes) should be double-spaced with wide margins. The editors request that the author's name and institutional affiliation be kept on a separate cover sheet whenever possible. Two copies should be sent to the Editors, Box 5, Notre Dame, Indiana 46556, U.S.A. We regret that manuscripts cannot be returned unless postage is included.

Page proofs are sent to authors for correction of errors that occur in composition. Any special composition costs arising from an author's revision of the text in proof will be charged to the author. Fifty reprints, without covers, will be supplied free of charge; covers or additional reprints may be purchased.

The *Notre Dame Journal of Formal Logic* is published quarterly by the University of Notre Dame in January, April, July and October.
