A seminar on Austrian Philosophy will be part
of the programme of the conference.

Scholars wishing to present a paper on a topic which falls within the above themes (papers for sections 2–6 need not be connected with Wittgenstein's philosophy) should request an abstract style sheet from either the President of the Austrian Wittgenstein Society, Dr. Adolf Hübner, Markt 234, A-2880 Kirchberg am Wechsel/Austria, or Professor Werner Leinfellner, University of Nebraska, Department of Philosophy, Lincoln, Nebraska 68508/USA. The deadline for receipt of abstracts is June 15, 1985. Should more papers be offered than can be accepted, selection will be by decision of the organizing committee. Contributors will be informed of the committee decision not later than July 15, 1985. Official languages will be English and German.

Those planning to attend the conference should contact Dr. Hübner at the above address for further information as soon as possible. Conference fees will be 1.200 Austrian Schillings for nonstudents and 400 Austrian Schillings for students.

GUIDE TO AUTHORS

The *Journal* encourages submission of articles in all areas of philosophical and mathematical logic; the philosophy, foundations, and history of logic and mathematics; and semantics for natural language. Manuscripts (including notes and references) should be typed on one side of the page only, double-spaced with wide margins. The editors request that the author's name and institutional affiliation be kept on a separate cover sheet. Handwritten symbols, ambiguous symbols (l vs 1, o vs O and 0), and non-Roman characters should be identified in the margin. Two copies should be sent to *Editors, P.O. Box 5, Notre Dame, Indiana 46556, U.S.A.* We regret that manuscripts cannot be returned unless postage is included.

Page proofs are sent to authors for correction of errors that occur in composition. Any special composition costs arising from an author's revision of the text in proof will be charged to the author. Fifty reprints, without covers, will be supplied free of charge; covers or additional reprints may be purchased.

The *Notre Dame Journal of Formal Logic* is published quarterly by the University of Notre Dame in January, April, July, and October.
