CORRECTIONS

CLARIFICATION ON THE BIRTH DATE OF PAVEL ALEKSANDROVICH FLORENSKIJ

Irving H. Anellis gives 9 January 1882 as the birth date of Florenskij in "Translator's Introduction: Father Pavel Florenskij", Vol. 4, no. 2 (April 1994), p. 157; in "P.A. Florenskij," on p. 162 of the same issue, "N.N." gives the date as 21 January 1882.

The [apparent] discrepancy is due to the difference between the "Old Style" or Julian calendar used in Russia prior to the 1917 revolution and the "New Style" or Gregorian calendar which was adopted in the Soviet Union in 1918. In the early nineteenth century, the Old Style (O.S.) calendar was 12 days behind the New Style (N.S.) calendar and in the late nineteenth and early twentieth century 13 behind. Accordingly, the date given by Anellis should therefore be read: "9 January 1882 (O.S.)."

CLARIFICATION ON RÓZSA PÉTER'S INTERNMENT

In one of the footnotes in my translation from the July issue may be somewhat misleading. In it I said that Peter "was interned in a Budapest camp." I got a clarification on this when I was in Hungary this summer. During the Fascist years, she had to live in the Jewish ghetto in Budapest, but not a concentration camp.
